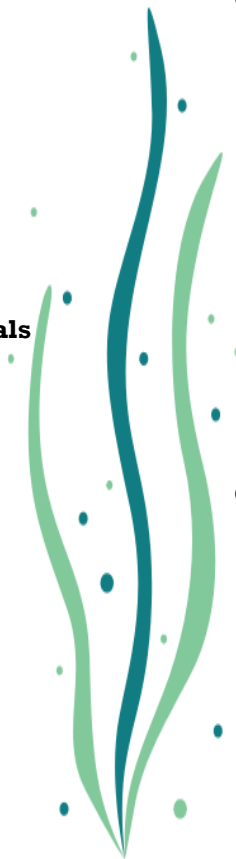

Mah Jongg takes place every Thursday in the library's Living Room.



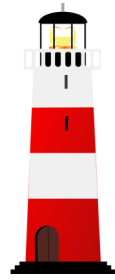
Puzzles at the Library

Get ready for summer with some relaxing self-care. Decorate a jar, and then mix your own custom sea salt scrub! No registration needed.

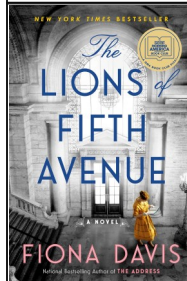
1000 Books Before Kindergarten Start your journey today!
